Safety Program

The Board recognizes its responsibility for the safety of students, district employees and others while on district property.

The superintendent shall provide, publish and post rules for safety and the prevention of accidents; ensure that students and employees are instructed in safety and accident prevention; provide protective devices where required for the safety of students and employees; and provide suitable and safe equipment for the conduct of ESD programs and services. Notwithstanding any administrative regulations requiring specific action, administrators shall take prompt action to correct any unsafe condition or circumstance that is brought to their attention. Likewise, the superintendent shall report to the Board any hazardous and unhealthy conditions if those conditions cannot be corrected through administrative action alone.

The superintendent shall prepare administrative regulations governing safety and the prevention of accidents, fire, mechanical and electrical malfunction, natural disasters and other hazards which shall include as a minimum the requirements of law and the applicable rules and regulations of various departments of state government. He/She shall appoint a staff member as safety officer, charged with responsibility for implementing the ESD's safety program. The safety and emergency plan of District 509J shall apply to the ESD.
